Halloween Safety Rules

- Children under nine years of age should go out with an adult or responsible older child.
- Be sure your child stops at all curbs, looks left, right and left again to check for traffic. Remind children to cross at crosswalks, street corners or intersections.
- Bright coloured costumes make your child easier to see. You can use reflective tape on a
 costume to make your child more visible. Face paint instead of a mask helps them to see
 well. Have your child carry a flashlight.
- When they get home, check all of their treats carefully. Throw out any treats that aren't
 wrapped, if the wrapping is torn or loose, or if the wrapper has a hole. Remember that small
 treats can cause your child to choke.
- You might want to offer an alternative to sugar based treats. Stickers or multi-coloured pencils can be a nice surprise in place of, or in addition to, traditional treats.
